
Support actions at **national level** encouraging the development of a culture of QA

Support actions at **EU level** contributing to the overall EU goal of 'Making LLL and mobility a reality'



EQAVET State of play







Sector Skills Alliances : objectives

- Bring education closer to labour market in order to better match VET provision with skills needs
 - improve economic sectors' competitiveness
 - implement the "New skills for jobs" agenda...
- Promote innovation, mutual trust and mobility tools
 - develop innovative ways of vocational teaching and training (WBL, ICT...)
 - implement learning outcomes (ECVET, EQF...), quality assurance (EQAVET)...
- Target dissemination strategy
 - > internet platforms, guidance services, human resource managers, VET schools
- Achieve systemic impact on training provision

Sector Skills Alliances : outcomes and added value

A new impetus for skills supply and pedagogical innovations...

- Reduce skills mismatch, increasing competitiveness and employability

- Operationalise the synergies between EU labour market intelligence activities and VET provision (complementing European Sector Skills Councils)

- Develop quality of alliance for systemic and sustainable impact (dissemination strategy, key actors commitment)



SECTOR SKILLS ALLIANCES

Large-scale projects in specific economic sectors

Target is 200 Alliances + 2000 participating institutions

Bringing together VET providers, enterprises and VET decision makers

Pilot phase: Preliminary results: 75 Applications - 3 with German coordinator

2. VET LEARNERS MOBILITY – ambitions for quality and quantity

Goal of 735 000 VET learner mobilities, contributing to new EU benchmark of 6% mobility of VET learners by 2020

A focus on work-based learning (apprenticeships, traineeships, placements), crucial for a successful transition from education to work



Erasmus for All Learning Mobility of Individuals

Quality mobility is essential: clear rights & responsibilities; good preparation; recognition of skills & competences acquired (ECVET credit transfer). Cooperation in consortia to promote stable cooperation

Results:

- Better qualified VET graduates
- Lower youth unemployment, easier transition from education to work
- Stronger networks and stable partnerships working together to organise high quality mobility



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
